ARTICLE 1, RELATING TO MAKING APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2018  
SECTION 1, APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2018

**Department of Administration**

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Pastore Center Campus Projects, Page 5, Line 14 by \$150,000 from \$8,905,000 to \$9,055,000. This amendment shifts \$150,000 for the Pastore Center Power Plant Project from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - RI Convention Center Authority, Page 5, Line 18 by \$250,000 from \$1,000,000 to \$1,250,000. This amendment shifts \$250,000 for the Rhode Island Convention Center Authority from FY 2017 to FY 2018. The Governor also recommends that an additional \$250,000 be added to FY 2019 and FY 2020, respectively, from surplus FY 2017 appropriations.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Dunkin Donuts Center, Page 5, Line 19 by \$500,000 from \$1,850,000 to \$2,350,000. This amendment shifts \$500,000 for the Dunkin Donuts Center from FY 2017 to FY 2018. The Governor also recommends that an additional \$500,000 be added to FY 2019 from surplus FY 2017 appropriations.

**Department of Children, Youth and Families**

Insert Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- Various Repairs and Improvements to Training School, Page 15, Insert After Line 2 by \$200,000 from \$0 to \$200,000. This amendment shifts \$400,000 from FY 2017 into later years for improvements to the Youth Detention Center including transferring \$200,000 into FY 2018 and \$200,000 into FY 2019.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- Generators – RITS, Page 15, Line 10 by \$50,000 from \$950,000 to \$1,000,000. This amendment shifts \$50,000 for the Generator Project at the Rhode Island Training School from FY 2017 into FY 2018.

**Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities and Hospitals**

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- Medical Center Rehabilitation, Page 18, Line 30 by \$2,500,000 from \$250,000 to \$2,750,000. This amendment provides additional funding needed for renovations at the Eleanor Slater Hospital, and Barry and Simpson Halls including \$2,500,000 in FY 2018 and \$1,500,000 in FY 2019 for a total of \$4,000,000.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- Hospital Consolidation, Page 19, Line 31 by \$1,000,000 from \$2,310,000 to \$3,310,000. This amendment shifts funding for the Hospital Consolidation funding to later years due to delays including an additional \$1,000,000 in FY 2018; \$1,000,000 in FY 2019 and \$500,000 in FY 2020 for a total of \$2,500,000.

**Department of Elementary and Secondary Education**

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds for the Davies HVAC project, Page 21, Line 8 by \$475,000 from \$2,499,000 to \$2,974,000. The increase reflects a revised project schedule for the Davies HVAC system and costs being deferred from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds for the Davies Asset Protection project, Page 21, Line 9 by \$140,000 from \$150,000 to \$290,000. The increase reflects a revised project schedule for general facility maintenance and costs being deferred from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

Insert After, Page 21, Line After 24 Met School HVAC Project by \$2,000,000 from \$0 to \$2,000,000. The increase reflects a revised project schedule for the Met School HVAC system and costs being deferred from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

**Department of Corrections**

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – D Building State Match-Reintegration Center (New Gloria MacDonald) Project, Page 26, Line 32 by \$250,000 from \$150,000 to \$400,000. This amendment shifts \$250,000 for the New Gloria MacDonald women’s facility from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

**Department of Environmental Management**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Recreational Facilities Improvements on Page 31, Line 19 by \$1,000,000 from \$2,450,000 to \$1,450,000. This amendment shifts \$1,000,000 for various improvements to the Department’s recreational facilities from FY 2018 to later years including \$500,000 in FY 2019 and FY 2020.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Natural Resources/Visitor’s Center on Page 31, Line 24 by \$2,000,000 from \$5,500,000 to \$3,500,000. This amendment shifts funding for the project into later years due to delays. The proposed funding would reduce FY 2018 by \$2,000,000 and shift this funding into FY 2019 resulting into a total available balance of \$2,954,244 in FY 2019.

**Department of Transportation**

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Highway Improvement Program on Page 33, Line 6 by \$3,400,000 from \$32,451,346 to \$35,851,346. This increase is to provide additional capital funding to the Department of Transportation.

Insert a new line entitled “Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – RIAC Capital Projects” on Page 33, After Line 6 in the amount of \$2,000,000. This new request for appropriation is to provide funding to the Rhode Island Airport Corporation (RIAC) for its Runway 16-34 project and other capital improvements at T. F. Green Airport.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Salt Storage Facilities on Page 33, Line 17 by \$750,000 from \$1,000,000 to \$1,750,000. This increase is a transfer of funding budgeted in FY 2017 to FY 2018. The Governor also requests an increase of \$750,000 in FY 2019

from surplus appropriations in FY 2017. The project at the East Providence facility was delayed until FY 2018.

### SECTION 10

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- DOA- Capital Hill Campus Projects, Page 37, Line 24 by \$580,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2019 from \$2,950,000 to \$3,530,000. This increase shifts funding for the Chapin project from FY 2017 to FY 2019.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- DOA- Pastore Center Campus Projects, Page 37, Line 227 by \$500,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2019 from \$6,105,000 to \$6,605,000. This increase shifts funding for the Pastore Center Electric Utility Upgrade project from FY 2017 to FY 2019.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- DOA- Zambarano Campus Projects, Page 37, Line 29 by \$1,000,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2020 from \$1,100,000 to \$2,100,000. This increase shifts funding for the Zambarano Buildings from FY 2017 to FY 2020.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- BHDDH – Hospital Reorganization, Page 38, Line 1 by \$1,000,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2019 from \$920,000 to \$1,920,000. This increase shifts funding for the project beginning in FY 2017 through FY 2020.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- BHDDH – Hospital Reorganization, Page 38, Line 1 by \$500,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2020 from \$0 to \$500,000. This increase shifts funding for the project beginning in FY 2017 through FY 2020.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- DOC- ISC Exterior Envelope and HVAC Project, Page 38, Line 10 by \$425,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2020 from \$2,200,000 to \$2,625,000. This increase shifts funding from FY 2017 to FY 2020.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- DOC- Medium Infrastructure Project, Page 38, Line 9 by \$1,000,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2019 from \$6,000,000 to \$7,000,000, by \$750,000 for the FY ending June 30, 2020 from \$7,000,000 to \$7,750,000. This increase shifts funding from FY 2017 to FY 2019 and FY 2020.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- DEM – Recreational Facility Improvements, Page 38, Line 14 by \$500,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2019 from \$1,600,000 to \$2,100,000. This increase shifts funding for the project beginning in FY 2018 through FY 2020.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- DEM – Recreational Facility Improvements, Page 38, Line 14 by \$500,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2019 from \$1,850,000 to \$2,350,000. This increase shifts funding for the project beginning in FY 2018 through FY 2020.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- DOT – Highway Improvement Program, Page 38, Line 15 by \$3,400,000 for the FY Ending June 30, 2019 from \$32,451,346 to \$35,851,346. This increases funding for the project for FY 2019.

ARTICLE 10, RELATING TO MAKING REVISED APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT  
OF FY 2017

SECTION 1, REVISED APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2017

**Department of Administration**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Pastore Center Power Plant, Page 4, Line 13 by \$800,000 from \$800,000 to \$0. This amendment removes funding for this project in FY 2017 and shifts \$150,000 for the Pastore Center Power Plant Project from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - RI Convention Center Authority, Page 4, Line 11 by \$750,000 from \$1,800,245 to \$1,050,245. This amendment shifts \$250,000 for the Rhode Island Convention Center Authority project from FY 2017 to FY 2018. The Governor also requests that the remaining funds being withdrawn in FY 2017 be added at \$250,000 annually to FY 2019 and FY 2020.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Dunkin Donuts Center, Page 4, Line 12 by \$1,000,000 from \$3,923,259 to \$2,923,259. This amendment shifts \$500,000 from FY 2017 to FY 2018. The Governor also requests that the remaining funds of \$500,000 being withdrawn in FY 2017 be added to FY 2019.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Zambarano Buildings, Page 3, Line 22 by \$1,000,000 from \$3,175,000 to \$2,175,000. This amendment withdraws \$1.0 million of unexpended appropriations from this project. To maintain total funding for this project over the five-year capital plan, the Governor requests that the funds withdrawn from FY 2017 be shifted to FY 2020.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Pastore Center Electrical Utility Upgrade, Page 4, Line 2 by \$500,000 from 2,635,622 to \$2,135,622. This amendment withdraws \$500,000 of unexpended appropriations from this project. To maintain total funding for this project over the five-year capital plan, the Governor requests that the funds withdrawn from FY 2017 be shifted to FY 2019.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Chapin Health Center, Page 4, Line 8 by \$580,000 from \$750,000 to \$170,000. This amendment withdraws \$580,000 of unexpended appropriations from this project. To maintain total funding for this project over the five-year capital plan, the Governor requests that the funds withdrawn from FY 2017 be shifted to FY 2019.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - DOIT Enterprise Operations Center, Page 3, Line 18 by \$370,000 from \$530,000 to \$160,000. This amendment withdraws \$370,000 based on actual estimated expenditures for this project in FY 2017.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Cannon Building, Page 3, Line 20 by \$26,910 from \$400,000 to \$426,910. This amendment adds \$26,910 based on actual estimated expenditures for this project in FY 2017.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Pastore Strategic Plan, Page 3, Line 23 by \$200,000 from \$1,325,000 to \$1,525,000. This amendment adds \$200,000 based on actual estimated expenditures for this project in FY 2017.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Old State House, Page 3, Line 24 by \$200,000 from \$250,000 to \$50,000. This amendment withdraws \$200,000 based on actual estimated expenditures for this project in FY 2017.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - William Powers Building, Page 4, Line 1 by \$200,000 from \$1,000,000 to \$800,000. This amendment withdraws \$200,000 based on actual estimated expenditures for this project in FY 2017.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Replacement of Fueling Tanks, Page 4, Line 3 by \$100,000 from \$295,610 to \$195,610. This amendment withdraws \$100,000 based on actual estimated expenditures for this project in FY 2017.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Pastore Center Parking, Page 4, Line 9 by \$185,000 from \$300,000 to \$115,000. This amendment withdraws \$185,000 based on actual estimated expenditures for this project in FY 2017.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Big River Management Area, Page 4, Line 5 by \$50,000 from \$131,720 to \$81,720. This amendment withdraws \$50,000 based on actual estimated expenditures for this project in FY 2017.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Pastore Cottages Rehabilitation, Page 4, Line 20 by \$100,782 from \$100,782 to \$0. This amendment withdraws \$100,782 based on revised plans for rehabilitation of these buildings.

Insert After Page 4, Line 20 Veterans Auditorium Land Purchase \$45,000. This amendment adds \$45,000 based on additional expenditures needed to complete this project in FY 2017.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - State House Energy Mgt. Improvements, Page 4, Line 18 by \$108,333 from \$108,333 to \$0. This amendment withdraws \$108,333 because no expenditures are planned for this project in FY 2017.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - State Facility Projects, Page 4, Line 17 by \$95,000 from \$95,000 to \$0. This amendment withdraws \$95,000 because no expenditures are planned for this project in FY 2017.

**Executive Office of Commerce**

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- I-195 Redevelopment District Commission, Page 8, Line 19 by \$33,317 from \$351,683 to \$385,000. This amendment increases funding for I-195 Commission projects in FY 2017 based on the current projected expenditure level.

**Department of Labor & Training**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Center General Asset Protection project, Page 9, Line 18 by \$500,000 from \$1,374,438 to \$874,438. This amendment withdraws \$500,000 based on actual estimated expenditures for this project in FY 2017.

**Department of Children, Youth and Families**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Various Repairs and Improvements to Training School, Page 16, Line 16 by \$400,000 from \$483,316 to \$83,316. This amendment shifts funding for this project to later years including \$200,000 in FY 2019 and \$200,000 in FY 2020.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Maintenance Building, Page 17, Line 1 by \$385,000 from \$385,000 to \$0. This amendment removes funding for this project until definite plans for the facility are known.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Generators - RITS, Page 17, Line 2 by \$50,000 from \$50,000 to \$0. This amendment shifts \$50,000 for this project from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

**Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities and Hospitals**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Communities Facilities Fire Code project, Page 22, Line 3 by \$400,000 from \$442,200 to \$42,200. This amendment reduces funding by \$400,000 in FY 2017 based on current projected expenditures for the project.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – MR Community Facilities/Access to Ind., Page 22, Line 21 by \$200,000 from \$500,000 to \$300,000. This amendment reduces funding by \$200,000 based on current projected expenditures for this project.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Regional Center Repair/Rehab, Page 22, Line 22 by \$474,363 from \$974,363 to \$500,000. This amendment reduces funding based on current projected expenditures for this project.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Hospital Consolidation, Page 23, Line 18 by \$2,437,767 from \$2,500,000 to \$62,333. This amendment shifts funding for this project to

later years including \$1,000,000 in FY 2018, \$1,000,000 in FY 2019, and \$500,000 in FY 2020.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Substance Abuse Asset Protection, Page 23, Line 9 by \$62,300 from \$100,000 to \$162,300. This amendment including additional funding for this project based on current projected expenditures.

**Department of Elementary and Secondary Education**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Davies HVAC project, Page 25, Line 17 by \$475,000 from \$498,808 to \$23,808. The decrease reflects a revised project schedule for the Davies HVAC system. The Governor requests that these funds be moved from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds in the Davies Asset Protection project, Page 25, Line 18 by \$140,000 from \$477,911 to \$337,911. The decrease reflects a revised project schedule for general facility maintenance. The Governor requests that these funds be moved from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds in the Met School HVAC project, Page 26, Line 7 by \$2,000,000 from \$3,131,996 to \$1,131,996. The decrease reflects a revised project schedule for the Met School HVAC system. The Governor requests that these funds be moved from FY 2017 to FY 2018.

**Department of Corrections**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- Asset Protection, Page 33, Line 17 by \$865,000 from \$3,185,969 to \$2,320,969. The decrease reflects a revised expenditure schedule for the project.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- Maximum General Renovations, Page 33, Line 18 by \$500,000 from \$1,324,253 to \$824,253. The decrease reflects a revised expenditure schedule for the project. The Governor requests that these funds be moved from FY 2017 to FY 2019.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- New Gloria MacDonald, Page 33, Line 19 by \$500,000 from \$539,133 to \$161,066. The decrease reflects a revised expenditure schedule for the project. The Governor requests that these funds be moved from FY 2017 to FY 2018 (\$250,000) and FY 2019 (\$250,000).

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- Dix Building Renovations, Page 33, Line 21 by \$150,000 from \$311,066 to \$389,133. The decrease reflects a revised expenditure schedule for the project. The Governor requests that these funds be moved from FY 2017 to FY 2019.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- ISC Exterior Envelope and HVAC, Page 33, Line 20 by \$425,000 from \$425,000 to \$0. The decrease reflects a revised start for the

project to FY 2018. The Governor requests that these funds be moved from FY 2017 to FY 2020.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- Medium Infrastructure, Page 33, Line 22 by \$1,750,000 from \$2,000,000 to \$250,000. The decrease reflects a revised expenditure schedule for the project. The Governor requests that these funds be moved from FY 2017 to FY 2019 (\$1,000,000) and FY 2020 (\$750,000).

#### **Judiciary**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds- Noel Shelled Buildout Project, Page 35, Line 7 by \$1,500,000 from \$3,405,070 to \$2,205,070. The decrease reflects a revised expenditure schedule for the project. The Governor requests that these funds be moved to FY 2019.

#### **Military Staff**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Joint Force Headquarters Building project, Page 36, Line 19 by \$525,000 from \$600,000 to \$75,000. This decrease is due to project delays associated with utility system design changes. The expenditure of \$525,000 is requested to be moved to FY 2019.

#### **Emergency Management Agency**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds - Hurricane Sandy Cleanup project, Page 38, Line 20 by \$232,075 from \$232,075 to \$0. No additional RICAP money is needed to match Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Hurricane Sandy disaster recovery funding. The State was required to fund a 25% state match for disaster recovery reimbursements. No RICAP money has been spent on Hurricane Sandy since FY 2014.

#### **Department of Environmental Management**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Natural Resources Offices/Visitors’ Center, Page 39, Line 24 by \$950,000 from \$1,062,259 to \$112,259. This amendment shifts funding for the project to later years due to delays. The proposed funding would reduce FY 2018 by \$2,000,000 and shift this funding into FY 2019 resulting into a total available balance of \$2,954,244 in FY 2019.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Marine Infrastructure/Pier Development, Page 39, Line 25 by \$100,000 from \$100,000 to \$0. This amendment removes funding for this project based on current projected expenditures levels.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds –Building Demolition, Page 39, Line 26 by \$100,000 from \$100,000 to \$0. This amendment removes funding for this project based on current projected expenditures levels.

**Coastal Resources Management Council**

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – RI Coastal Storm Risk Study, Page 40, Line 20 by \$150,000 from \$150,000 to \$0. This decrease is due to a delay in the project, and is pushed out until FY 2020. The project's budget in FY 2018 and FY 2019 remains the same.

**Department of Transportation**

Insert Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – RIAC Capital Project, Page 41, After Line 14 in the amount of \$3,000,000. This addition is to provide funding to the Rhode Island Airport Corporation for an expansion to the Federal Inspection Services facility at T.F. Green Airport. The expansion is to support the new international flights scheduled to begin later this summer.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Salt Storage Facilities, Page 41, Line 26 by \$1,500,000 from \$1,961,934 to \$461,934. This decrease is due to a delay in the project at the East Providence facility. The funds are reallocated to FY 2018 and FY 2019.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Train Station Maintenance and Repairs, Page 42, Line 3 by \$323,555 from \$673,555 to \$350,000. This decrease is based on current projected expenditures.
